As medical information advances and as physicians are expected to acquire that knowledge ever more rapidly, it is important to know how one best absorbs information. *Differences in adult learning styles are explored, and learners are taught specific techniques to capitalize on their personal styles to optimize life-long learning.* The use of computerized medical records and on-line medical search engines for day-to-day patient care and self-directed learning is taught. The critique of sources of medical information (especially on-line) is taught, as well as methods of finding specific sources of information. Day-to-day demonstrations of on-line education, medical searches, and the use of hand-held digital technologies to enhance patient care and life-long learning are also part of hands-on training.
